Our Charge from the Board: To integrate health analysis into climate change programs

Resolution 17-46 from the California Air Resources Board (CARB) directs staff to work with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) and other state agencies to establish a timeline and an action plan to better integrate health analysis into the State's climate change programs

Reasons for a Health Analysis

- Chronic conditions are the leading causes of death and disease in CA
- Climate change is one of the most pressing and far reaching issues faced by the state, including in the area of public health
- Climate mitigation policies have the capability to improve public health
 - But some may pose risks to health
