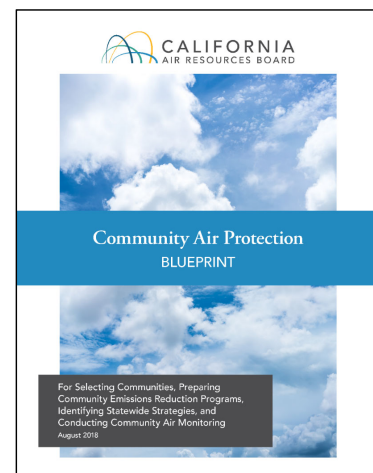
Building a Community-Focused Framework

Defines statewide strategies and sets requirements for:

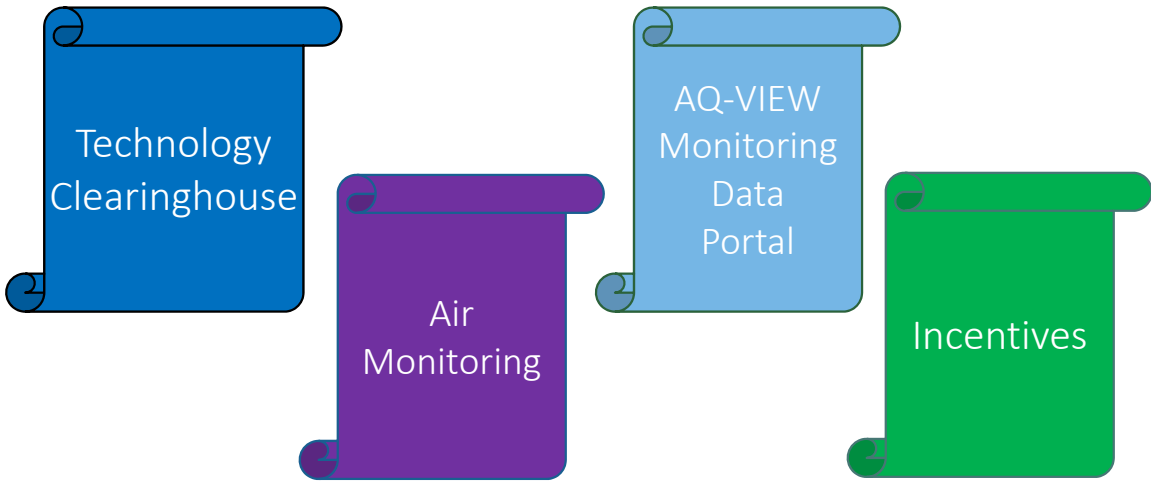
- Public engagement and community partnerships

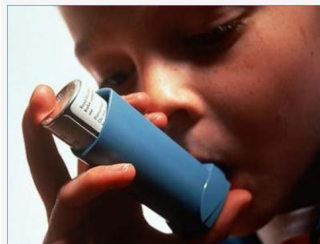

Community Air Protection Funds

Overview

- \$495 million so far – additional \$200 million proposed
- Air districts implement in consultation with communities
- Reduce toxics, smog-forming pollutants and greenhouse gases
 - Replace dirty engines with cleaner or zero emission technologies
 - Stationary Sources (i.e. chrome plating)

Project Types

- Reduce Chrome Plating Emissions
- Scrap Dirty
 - Trucks
 - Off-Road Equipment
 - Marine Vessels
 - Locomotives
- Replace with Cleaner Alternatives and Infrastructure
- Cleanup School Facilities
 - K-12 public schools
 - Air Filtration
 - Zero Emission Lawn and Garden
 - Low-Emitting Formaldehyde
 - Transportation



Guiding Principles for Allocations

- Listening to Communities
- Significant portion to the initial communities selected by the Board
- Consider precedent set by the Legislature with the specified allocation of funds in the first year
- Consider the needs of other communities that CARB “is considering for selection in future years” per SB 856
- Provide Community Air Protection Funds to smaller districts for projects in their disadvantaged communities

Next Steps

- March 8 - publish proposed Guidelines for public comment
- April 25-26 - present proposed Guidelines to Board
- Continued guidance from communities is critical
 - Direction on creation of additional stationary source categories
 - New incentive options for community emissions reduction programs
- Allow flexibility to meet community needs as they are identified
